Provincial Recognition for Age-Friendly Strategy (5:50)

Leduc-Beaumont MLA Brad Rutherford presented a certificate of recognition for the City of Beaumont's <u>Age-Friendly Strategy</u> on behalf of Minister of Seniors and Housing Josephine Pon. The strategy provides a vision and actions to make Beaumont more inclusive and accessible for older people.

Open Forum - Land Use Bylaw (11:11)

Beaumont residents expressed concerns that a home in Triomphe is not appropriate for the neighbourhood and requested a review of the Land Use Bylaw.

Update on Implementation of the Restriction Exemption Program (31:51)

City Administration <u>provided an update</u> on the implementation of the Alberta government's Restriction Exemption Program at city recreation facilities and the program's impacts. Council heard that rental and membership revenues have been affected by the program and the City has additional costs for security.

2020 City of Beaumont Budget (50:52)

Council approved the operating, capital and utilities budgets for 2022. Budget details are available on the City's website.

Council Membership on Subdivision and Development Appeal Board (1:00:56)

Council voted to change the <u>membership of the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board</u> to no longer include members of Council. The Board is an independent tribunal that hears appeals relating to development permit decision, enforcement orders, and subdivision applications.

Dansereau Meadows Redistricting (1:10:39)

Council approved the first of three votes for a bylaw that would <u>change the land use</u> for a portion of the Dansereau Meadows neighbourhood from Conventional Neighbourhood District to Integrated Neighbourhood District.

Library Board Bylaw (0:09) [Part 2]

Council <u>approved changes</u> to the bylaw governing Beaumont's library board that clarify control of its finances and make sure it is in alignment with provincial legislation.

Fees and Charges (8:38) [Part 2]

Council approved <u>2022 fees and charges</u> for city services and facilities, including building permits, child care, recreation, and transit. Council also approved a reduced meeting room rental fee for local non-for-profits and volunteer organizations at the Beaumont Community Centre.
