Clean Energy Improvement Tax Bylaw (5:25)

Following a public hearing, Council <u>approved a bylaw</u> that would enable property owners to apply for a low-interest loan from the City of Beaumont to pay for clean energy upgrades to their home our building and pay it back with their property tax bill. The program is expected to launch in 2023.

Council also approved a motion directing Administration to examine options for requiring the loans to be registered on land titles.

Capital Plan 10-year Forecast (51:33) and continued at (0:10) [Part 2]

City Administration presented a <u>report projecting the capital projects</u> to address Beaumont's growth and expected needs in the next 10 years. Council received the report for information and will hold a Special Council Meeting on September 19 to discuss the projects in more detail and consider changes to the 10-year forecast.

Recreation Vehicle (RV) Sani-Station (4:51) [Part 2]

City Administration presented a <u>report examining the feasibility and options for an RV sani-station</u> in Beaumont. Council received the report for information.

Vandalism and Loitering at Playgrounds (16:20) [Part 2]

Council approved a <u>motion by Councillors Catherine McCook and Ashley Miller</u> directing administration to prepare a report on the frequency of loitering and vandalism at playgrounds and options to address the problems.
