BURNING SHALL BE DONE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE *FOREST AND PRAIRIE PROTECTION ACT OF ALBERTA* AND *REGULATIONS* MADE THEREUNDER, THE CITY OF BEAUMONT BURNING BYLAW #815-13, AND THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

1. Burn only when **winds are less than 20km/h**. Contact *Alberta Environment* at 468-4940 for current weather updates.
2. While burning is being conducted, an **adult person must be in attendance**.
3. **Sufficient tools, equipment and sufficient quantity of water must be readily available**; depending on the size and composition of the burn being conducted.
4. If burning **within 800 meters of a primary or secondary highway, smoke signs must be posted on adjacent highways** before starting a fire. Contact *Alberta Transportation* at 818-9351 for more information pertaining to adequate signage.
5. Persons issued burning permits must conduct all burning with **due consideration to the physical discomfort of neighbors** that may be the result of products burning.
6. Before lighting a fire, call the *Parkland Dispatch* non-emergency line at 780-968-8401 to advise you will be burning.
7. Other conditions set forth in a valid Fire Permit issued by Beaumont Fire Service.

I HAVE READ, UNDERSTOOD AND AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS ATTACHED TO THE ISSUANCE OF A FIRE PERMIT IN THE CITY OF BEAUMONT, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE CONDITIONS LISTED ABOVE AND THE REGULATIONS ON THE REVERSE SIDE OF THIS APPLICATION. REGULATIONS

EXTRACTS FROM THE *FOREST AND PRAIRIE PROTECTION ACT OF ALBERTA*

- Section 19** (3) A fire permit is valid only for the period for which it is issued.
- (4) A forest officer or fire guardian issuing a fire permit may endorse on the permit any special fire control conditions with which the application must comply in addition to the provisions of this Act and the Regulations.
- Section 20** A fire permit may be suspended or cancelled at any time by a forest officer or fire guardian and upon receiving notice of the suspension or cancellation the person concerned shall immediately extinguish any fire set pursuant to his permit.
- Section 21** (1) For the purpose of fire control the Minister may, by order,
- (a) suspend or cancel within any part or all of Alberta all fire permits, or
 - (b) prohibit the lighting or require extinguishing of a fire set other than under the authority of a fire permit.
- (2) The order made pursuant to subsection (1) shall immediately publish at least twice a day for not less than two consecutive days by such radio and television stations or through such other means of communication as are considered by the Minister most likely to bring the matter to the attention of the public.
- (3) In any area affected by an order made pursuant to subsection (1) every person shall immediately proceed to extinguish every open outdoor fire lit by him or under his authority and every fire located on land occupied or owned by him.
- Section 22** No person shall
- (a) light an outdoor fire without first taking sufficient precautions to ensure that the fire can be kept under control at all times,
 - (b) light an outdoor fire when any fire hazard or burning hazard is conducive to a fire readily escaping out of control,
 - (c) fail to take reasonable steps to control a fire for the purpose of preventing it from spreading onto land other than his own,
 - (d) Deposit, discard or leave any burning matter or substance in a place where it might ignite other matter and result in a fire.

EXTRACTIONS FROM THE *FOREST AND PRAIRIE PROTECTION ACT OF ALBERTA REGULATIONS PART 1*

- Section 4** Every person who sets a fire under authority of a permit shall
- (a) keep the permit at the site of the fire;
 - (b) produce and show the permit to an officer on request;
 - (c) keep the fire under control;
 - (d) extinguish the fire before expiration of the permit or upon cancellation of the permit;
 - (e) have a responsible person in attendance at the fire at all times, except as may be otherwise authorized by a Forest Officer.
