What Should I Look For?

- ANYONE TRYING TO CONCEAL THEMSELVES: avoiding detection with hoodies, sunglasses or baseball hats.
- ANYONE WHO APPEARS ANXIOUS, NERVOUS OR IS LOOKING FOR SECURITY CAMERAS.
- ANYONE WHO IS IN AN AGITATED STATE. Do not approach and call police to assist.

What Should I Do?

- Post signs stating that hoodies, baseball hats and sunglasses must be removed prior to entering the premise.
- Have signs throughout stating the premise is monitored by video surveillance.
- Keep a pen and paper nearby so you can record details of suspicious people and vehicles.
- Make sure employees know what to do and who to call if an incident, such as a robbery, occurs.
- Don't hesitate to call police if something is suspicious. If something doesn't feel right, it probably isn't.
- Call 911 during a crime in progress or in an emergency.

OTHER TIPS

- Keep perimeter clear of anything that could be used to break a window or be used as a ladder.
- Get to know the owners and employees of neighbouring businesses and keep an eye out for each other.
- · Consider installing a panic button.
- Try to greet everyone who comes into your business. This lets them know that you see them and are aware of their presence.
- Have clear sightlines looking into your store.
 Potential thieves do not like to be seen. They prefer to feel like they are anonymous.
- Have clear sightlines within your store. This allows you to watch customers and reduces their feelings of anonymity.
- Set rules for your business and have them clearly visible. Ex: Abuse of any kind toward employees will not be tolerated or backpacks must be left at the front of the store.
